We're excited to launch our Chemistry Week Competition open to all KS3, KS4, and KS5 students!



Please be aware that Birchwood High School is unable to offer any funding in respect of school support for this bursary. Therefore, in the event of a bursary being offered by HMS, the remaining 50% will have to be self-funded by parents/carers.

Students currently receiving 25% school subsidy for orchestral instruments at Grade 2 and above and those taking GCSE (Y10 & Y11) and A level will continue to receive the 25% discount irrespective of their instrument.

Year 9 - D of E - Thursday 26 June

Emails confirming your child's attendance for the DofE training day have been sent today but we still have limited places available - please email trips@birchwoodhigh.org.uk to add your child's name to the list. If oversubscribed, names will be drawn at random.

In the Duke of Edinburgh's Award (DofE), participants engage in four main sections: Volunteering, Skills, Physical Recreation, and Expeditions. The DofE aims to help individuals develop personal skills and confidence through these activities. The DofE is designed to be challenging and rewarding, helping young people develop valuable skills and build their confidence. Participants set goals, track their progress, and seek feedback from assessors throughout the program.

At the taster day during enrichment week, you will complete some the activities that you will need for the expedition - tent building, cooking with Tranjias, walking with equipment, map navigating.



Year 10 Mock Exams

In order to prepare students for their public GCSE exams next summer, we will be holding a series of formal assessments over the next half term, which will feed into the final report of the year. These assessments will mostly take place between the 16 June to 4 July.

The majority of subjects will be holding GCSE style assessments in lessons, but in order to ensure students become familiar with the processes of public examinations, we will be holding two full mock exams in the Sports Hall, one each for Maths and English. It will also be an opportunity for students who will receive exam access arrangements to experience the organisation of these processes.

Maths Mock Exam Revision

To support preparations for the Maths Mock Exam on 17th June, and students transition into Year 11, Maths revision will be held each fortnight for the rest of this term:

Monday, Week B at 3.15pm in the Maths corridor.

Early next term, you will have the opportunity to purchase a pack of past papers for students to be using at home. This is in addition to those we have already started working through in school. If you are purchasing any other revision materials for your child to use at home, please be advised that we are following the Edexcel 9-1 course. Set 1 and 2 are following the Higher course; sets 3, 4 and 5 are following the Foundation course.

Year 10 English Revision Sessions - Starting 11 June

We are pleased to offer after-school English revision sessions for Year 10 students as they begin preparing for next year's GCSE exams. These sessions will help build key skills in both Literature and Language, including essay writing, analysis, and interpretation.

Sessions run Wednesdays from 15:15 to 16:00, starting Wednesday 11 June, in D block classrooms. Students should attend their usual English teacher's room, or are welcome to join another group if their teacher is unavailable.

YEAR 11

Arrangements for Study/Exam Leave after Half Term

Year 11 students are not required to be in school after half term, except to attend their relevant public exams.

Teachers will be available in the normal timetabled slots until the last exam in each subject, should students wish to attend lessons to ask questions and receive help.

We would be grateful if you could remind your child of the following important points:

- Full uniform should still be worn, unless there is a specific agreement in place. Hoodies whether leavers style or not, are not part of the formal uniform and are therefore not permitted in the exam hall.
- Students should be at the exam venue for 9am for morning exams. Students will effectively be registered in their exam by attendance so do not need to attend form time with their form tutor.
- Students should be at the exam venue for 1pm for afternoon exams. They should enter the site via Visitor Reception for larger exams we will aim to briefly open the main pedestrian gate at 12.45pm
- Once an exam is completed students should either leave the site immediately or attend lessons for support from staff. For safeguarding purposes we cannot accommodate students onsite unless they are in an exam, waiting to enter an exam or within a lesson.
- A small number of students are still forgetting relevant equipment such as pens, pencils, calculators etc. please could you help support students in attending exams fully prepared.

Please note that the canteen will not be available outside of normal opening times, so students should ensure they attend school with full water bottles etc.

Our Year 11s have been fantastic in their attitude and approach to the exams so far - we wish all students good luck for the last few weeks of the exam period!


