### **Update from Mrs Hinski**

We welcomed Year 8 back into the summer term with a sunny start on Tuesday.

### **Year 9 Options, PE Overview:**

With Options Evening tomorrow, here's a quick summary for PE & Sport options for Key Stage 4.

GCSE PE - If you play sports for clubs outside of school and attend school teams / represent school. Nearly all lessons are theory.

Examined via 3x Practical sports, 1x Coursework project & 2x Exam papers. (Totals 1xGCSE Grade)

Sports Science / Studies - If you have a keen interest in sport and enjoy learning in a more practical way.

Maybe you only play one sport, or only attend enrichment, don't play any sport for clubs but still enjoy sport, nutrition & Fitness & coaching.

Examined via 2x coursework projects & 1x Short exam paper. (Totals 1xGCSE Grade Equivalent)

Core PE - 100% Practical lessons for sports activities that you select and choose depending on your interests / preferences.
