PRIDE MONTH

June is LGBT+ Pride month in the UK - a month-long celebration of LGBT+ lives and progress, whilst commemorating the contributions of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer community throughout history.

All students received a Powerpoint presentation at the start of the month in morning form times. The Powerpoint detailed the story of the Stonewall riots which were a series of spontaneous demonstrations against a violent police raid that took place in the early morning hours of June 28th 1969 at the Stonewall Inn - a famous gay bar - in New York City. There was global outrage at the treatment of LGBT+ people as a result of these raids and subsequently the LGBT+ Pride

movement was born. Students also watched an interview with Keegan Hirst, the first British Rugby League player to come out. Keegan has since done a huge amount work to raise the profile of LGBT+ people within sport, campaigning for an attitude of respect and kindness without exception, whatever your sexuality or gender identity.

On Thursday 12 June, students in year 7, 8 & 9 received a virtual live talk from James Child - the first openly gay referee in the rugby league, who officiated at four consecutive world cups. James spoke of the homophobia he experienced post-coming out as gay whilst also highlighting the wealth of support received from the professional rugby community and wider sporting world. James said that acting with respect and empathy regardless of someone's sexuality is vital to ensure we can all live in a world where everyone can thrive as who they authentically are.

We are thrilled to share that Birchwood High School has raised £3,600 this year for ARC (Animal Rescue Charity). A representative from ARC visited earlier this week to collect the cheque from our House Captains and expressed heartfelt thanks on behalf of the charity.

ARC, which rehomed over 250 animals last year and more than 10,000 since 1991, said the donation will help cover vet bills for the 53 cats (including 22 kittens) and 16 dogs currently in their care. It will also go toward vital supplies like kitten food and litter—with the centre using up to 48 pouches of food a day.
