Birchwood Politics Students take part in the BBC Victoria Derbyshire Programme.

Birchwood A Level Politics students have again participated in a political discussion on television. At a time when it is often heard that the youth feel disengaged with politics and that little effort is made to listen to them, it is rewarding to see young people not only actively engaged, but also challenging those at the heart of decision making.

On the 12 December 2018, I emailed the Victoria Derbyshire programme while watching the updates on the vote of no confidence against Theresa May - "I am currently in Year 13 and my politics class are watching your news broadcast. We believe that for our future we should remain in the EU. May is paying too much attention to the back-stop and not enough to the generation that will succeed her." I received an email back from the production team saying that they were keen to get in touch.

Fast forward to 16 January 2019, I received a text from one of the production team saying that they were very eager for me and my politics class to come into the studio to be on the show the following morning. Josh Bains, Matthew Gleeson and Ricardo Olender De Mata agreed to come with me. Each of us was called by a member of the production team in the evening and asked about our thoughts on the current political climate and about any questions we would like to ask the MPs that would be present. The next morning we headed into London, into the studio and met Victoria Derbyshire to have a chat with her and go over our questions before going live. 'Brexit: what happens next?' allowed us to question MPs and share our opinions. We were all very pleased with our questions addressed to MPs Anneliese Dodds, Rachel Maclean and Ian Murray and felt that we got the responses we desired. I feel very honoured that I was given the chance to represent our generation during a time when it seems we don't get much of a voice. Do watch our appearance on the Victoria Derbyshire programme!


Dear Parents / Carers

I hope you all had an enjoyable and well-deserved Christmas Break. The Spring Term is really the business end of school life for Year 11 and 13 students with only 15 weeks to go before the public exams begin. I have been very impressed with the way that the vast majority of our students have settled back to school life, working hard in lessons and getting involved in clubs and other extra-curricular activities – a real credit to themselves and their families.

My assemblies at the start of this term focused on the year ahead – Scientists claim that 2019 is the year that we human beings need to change our ways and begin to look after the planet properly. There is certainly some strong evidence to support these claims – rising global temperatures and the mass extinction of large mammals are but two concerns. It is easy for a young person to think what difference will I make but the 'Think Global, Act Local' campaign is one that offers really good practical changes that will make a difference if everyone subscribes. For example, walking to school instead of getting a lift, being more energy conscious, and looking to recycle as much as possible is something that would help at home and at school.

We are really fortunate at Birchwood that we have invested in good facilities but it is important that we look after them. You will be aware that Government funding is affecting all schools – cuts to Sixth Form funding and increasing employer costs means that all schools are finding it hard to make 'ends-meet.' We are fortunate that Birchwood is a large school with a stable roll but we are having to be careful. As we look to the future, this will not necessarily mean that class sizes will increase, or that resources and investment will be cut - but achieving better value for money is a priority. This topic was brought up on the BBC Victoria Derbyshire show on 12 January when four of our A Level Government & Politics students were quizzed on Brexit and education. I thought Keeva Wilson, Ricardo Olender, Josh Baines and Matt Gleeson did incredibly well on a live and unscripted programme.

I would like to thank you as parents for the tremendous support that you give us on a day-to-day basis making sure that your son or daughter is ready for school each day. If you have any concerns or need additional support, please do not hesitate in to contact by phone or via the dedicated email system on our new website.



We also have a strong and supportive the Parent Council and Governing Body – we still have one vacancy on Parent Council for a Year 7 representative to attend three meetings a year – the minutes of previous meetings can be found on our website if you would like to find out more.

We also have two vacancies on the Governing Body for Community Governors. Being a school governor at Birchwood is a rewarding and fulfilling responsibility and gives you an opportunity to contribute strategically to the lives and opportunities of 1400 students. The Governing Body is made up of six Parent Governors, ten Community Governors and four Staff Governors. In terms of background experience, we have a wide range of expertise including governors from educational, commercial, personnel and finance backgrounds so we would welcome anyone with complementary skills and aptitudes. We are particularly keen to diversify membership to be more reflective of our student body so we would like to hear from anyone from a BME background or someone who is in receipt of income support or has received financial support in the past.

In terms of time commitment, governors attend twelve evening meetings per year. All paperwork is sent out in advance and we provide full induction and training as required. Most Governors also give up some time each year to visit the school during its working day to help support School Leaders. Finally, I hope you enjoy reading all the stories in this edition of Birchwood News – full of accounts of our exceptional students going above and beyond just coming to school. This year, my challenge is to raise money to help to build a small kitchen where food can be prepared for the children.


