....Safe Drive Stay Alive Campaign....



As part of the PSHCE sessions, which ran the week commencing 7 December our Sixth Form students took part in a road safety campaign in conjunction with the Safe Drive Stay alive campaign incorporating our local fire station, ambulance service and police service. Safe Drive Stay Alive was launched in 2013 by emergency services to help reduce the number of young people killed and seriously injured on our roads. FINANCE

I am Mrs Young, the parental and student contact in relation to all income to the school.

We use an online payment system, ParentPay for administration of the school income, especially in these current times. We would like to keep the students and ourselves as safe as possible so encourage everyone to use this method for paying for school meals and any equipment needed. Please note that school meals are the only item that can still be paid via a cash machine in the Café. However, we are aware of a small number of people where this is not possible and in exceptional circumstances we ask that you provide an exact value cheque (payable to Birchwood High School) as we no longer would like to handle cash in these current times (finance envelopes are available from the finance office). All income received by cheque will be entered onto the ParentPay system. This will only be for a minority of students.

General Information on making cards

Who can make cards? Anyone and everyone can!

Making cards for hospitalised and seriously ill children is a simple yet very fun and creative way to make a difference. People of all ages and artistic abilities can create cards. We have even had two year olds make cards for us, so there is definitely no age limit or artistic ability needed.

Where do the cards go? What happens after I have sent them in? Our cards go to a range of different hospitals in the UK, as well as children who are unwell but being cared for at home or in a hospice. Making cards is simple and can take a matter of minutes, yet the impact is huge. When a child receives your card, the aim is to brighten their day and help them remain positive as well as remind them someone is thinking of them. We also distribute some cards to geriatric wards. Elders often do not have many visitors whilst in hospital and they love the cards they receive! Remember the key tips: • Do not write "Get Well Soon" on the cards – positive messages only! • Make sure all cards are handmade • Please avoid religious references • Sign the cards "Cards for Bravery", you can put your name on the back if wanted • Most importantly – get CREATIVE and have FUN. (Please note Katie is not looking for Christmas cards). www.cardsforbravery.com

HEADLINES

Looking back on this term, the standout feature for me is how teachers and support staff had really missed the students during the March-July lockdown and equally how students had missed coming to school, the routine, seeing their friends and learning in a non-virtual world. It has not been easy managing a school with 1400 students and 150 members of staff amidst a global pandemic but there have been a lot of pluses – most notably the brilliant teamwork from all members of staff and really positive attitudes to catch up with lost learning from students.

We are not 'out of the woods' yet so we will exercise caution for the Spring Term, and hope that the mass roll out of the vaccination programme ensures that the most vulnerable people in society are kept safe.

Our Chair of Governors, Mark Stocker, ended his term of office recently after eight years at the helm. Mark told me that he hoped his legacy would be that Birchwood is now in a strong position to build for the future and that he was proud of the fact that our ethos has remained undiminished – to provide an excellent all-round education for local students regardless of background or ability. I would certainly agree with this viewpoint. Catherine Gater is now Chair of Governors having been Vice Chair, and there is a pen portrait below. Our Governors are certainly a hard-working and talented group who give up a lot of their free time to support the school.

I have been a governor at Birchwood since 2016 and both my children have attended the school. I am a great admirer of the inclusive ethos of the Birchwood community and I have a particular interest in science and SEND. Previously Vice Chair, I am delighted and honoured to step into the role of Chair to build on the excellent work of our outgoing Chair, Mark Stocker. I look forward to working with our strong team of governors and senior leaders.



My background is in science and I studied at St Catherine's College, Oxford, followed by Imperial College, London. I have worked for several years in large international facilities and in the public sector, including CERN, the European Bioinformatics Institute, the Science Museum and the British Library. I currently specialise in diversity and inclusion projects. I am an enthusiastic (if very slow) runner and recently took part in the virtual London Marathon, and I am also a keen knitter and blogger.

I have been impressed with the way our students have wanted to engage in seasonal events like our excellent Xmas Card Competition and helping with charitable causes such as our amazing food bank collection to help local families who are struggling financially (see photo above). Students have also been actively involved in wider social issues such as Black Lives Matter and a commitment to 2021 to reduce our carbon footprint and become a 'greener' school.




Student leadership was seen as a great strength of the school in the 2019 Ofsted inspection and I would concur with this – they certainly keep me on my toes! The general consensus is that the Autumn Term has gone well, all things considered. They liked the fact that there had been no drastic changes of plan and generally, students felt safe and knew the rules. Students present thought that their teachers had worked really hard too and it was much better being at school – even with facemasks – than working from home.

Finally, can I say a big thank you to parents, coping with your own family pressures whilst supporting your child in terms of coming to school each day and completing any homework set. The fact that average attendance has been 94% compared to Hertfordshire's 87% average shows that our students want to come to school despite the continuing disruption caused by Covid19.

9JDY went for a "Grinch" themed room which was very imaginative, they even went as far as decorating their form door.




Well Done to 11RNN for their impressive herd of reindeer hanging from the ceiling in their form room.

Safer Schools Newsletter December 2020

Get Safe Online

With new phones and other devices allowing access to the internet on so many Christmas wish lists we thought this would be a good time to remind everyone about how to stay safe online.

Love it or hate it, chances are your child will be online gaming this Christmas. If you're like most parents, you'll have children who play games online, whether on a tablet, mobile, computer or console.

In most cases, online gaming is fun, social and harm-free. But we need to be realistic, and parents are right to

be concerned about a world they may not be familiar with. The risks range from downloading a computer virus, to bullying or even being targeted by a predator with sinister motives.

As parents, it's impossible to know what your children are doing all of the time, particularly when it comes to online gaming. In the same way you would warn your kids about the risks of riding a bike or crossing a road, it's important to educate them to online security dangers early on so you can feel comfortable knowing they are playing safely and know when to alert someone to anything suspicious.

Top Tips for Safe Online Gaming

- Have an open and honest talk with your kids about online gaming and the risks involved.
- Tell them never to reveal private information like their real name, email address, home address, telephone numbers, family members, financial details or school they go to.
- Explain that not everybody is who they seem or claim to be, and their motives may be suspicious.
- Tell them not to respond to bullying or other abuse, and to tell you straight away if it happens.
- Tell them to tell you straight away if someone makes inappropriate suggestions or makes them feel uncomfortable online.
- Join in with their gaming sometimes, to get an idea of the games and who they're connecting with.
- Set and monitor limits for the amount of daily or weekly time your kids spend online gaming.
- Check age ratings of games to ensure your kids aren't accessing inappropriate content.
- Never give your child your payment card details as extras can be very costly.

Bike Marking

Hertfordshire is a safe place with some of the lowest crime levels in the country. Despite this more than 1,000 bicycles are reported stolen every year and of those recovered, most are auctioned simply because there's no way of knowing who the owners are. Failure to secure or register them correctly makes them an easy target for thieves.

Hertfordshire Constabulary has joined the National BikeRegister Scheme (the UK's national cycle database and the leading security marking and registration initiative), proven to reduce cycle theft and identify stolen bikes.

To reduce the chances of becoming a victim of cycle theft, we highly recommend the use of a Secured by Design BikeRegister marking kit and the The BikeRegister APP, is a convenient way for police officers to search the BikeRegister database for ownership details of recovered bikes and gives officers access to vital

information in real-time.

Hertfordshire Constabulary holds regular bike marking events around the county. Bike marking is provided FREE to members of the public and is used to help support road safety. If you own a bike, you are strongly recommended to ensure the bike is registered at any advertised event or you may register the bike yourself at:

www.bikeregister.com/

Registering on BikeRegister is a vital step in the fight against bike theft, and means you can be reunited with your bikes in the event of them being stolen.

Cyberbullying

What is Cyberbullying and online Harassment?

- Cyberbullying is any form of bullying which takes place online.
- This can be done over smartphones, tablets, online gaming, chat rooms, social media and more.
- Online harassment is the act of sending offensive, rude and insulting messages and being abusive.
- If someone purposefully keeps sending you offensive messages that make you feel scared, it could be illegal.



Cyberbullying is NOT ACCEPTABLE

- Bullying someone whether online or offline is wrong.
- It can badly affect their mental health.
- Harassing someone and/or sending malicious or threatening messages to someone repeatedly is **ILLEGAL**.
- If you are found to be cyberbullying someone, there could be criminal consequences.

What to do if you are being cyberbullied

If someone is bullying you, here is what you can do to put a stop to it...get **SMART**.

- S**creenshot any nasty messages.
- M**y privacy settings.
- A**void talking to them any further.
- R**eport the incident on whatever site you are using.
- T**alk to someone (parent, carer, teacher, friend or the police if necessary).

How to cope with the effects of Cyberbullying

- You must not blame yourself. No one deserves to be treated cruelly by anyone.
- It can make you feel very upset, alone and like no one will understand or help you.
- **REMEMBER** you are not alone and there are lots of people who can help you. Make sure you tell someone and do not try to deal with this on your own.

- If you are ever threatened with physical harm, being repeatedly harassed, being sent malicious messages.
