## A Level History – Year 12 Preparation Work

**Unit Y107 –** British period study and enquiry – England 1547-1603: Mid Tudor Crisis and The Later Tudors.

**Unit Y216 –** Non-British period study – The USA in the 19<sup>th</sup> century: Westward expansion and Civil War 1803-c.1890.

### In practical terms, you will need a few things:-

- 1. Two lever-arch folders (one for each side of the course)

# In preparation for the start of the course in September, you should complete the following tasks:-

Unit Y107 – British period study and enquiry – England 1547-1603: the Later Tudors.

You should produce your own timeline of the Tudor period (1485-1603), following research, so that you have a basic general background knowledge of, and get a feel for, the changes during this time. You should include key dates and brief details for the following:-

- Changes in monarchy
- Changes in religion
- Rebellions and plots
- Wars

Carry out some research on the last year of Henry VIII.

There are a number of books that are useful for this side of the course that can be found quite cheaply online as second hand books. You might wish to purchase your own copies in advance and start reading to gain greater contextual knowledge.
