Year Council feedback

Year 7

- Improvement to social recreation area broken football goal could this be fixed?
- Social recreation area next academic (Year 8) benches to be provided to be able to sit and socialise – improving the Year 8 hard court is a key development point.
- Home learning generally lots of homework Bedrock there is too much home learning set whilst very little home learning is set in Science. Sometimes home learning is set with very short due dates.

- When there is no teachers on duty outside the Year 7 toilets, older students using them sometimes for vaping. Action: It is important that we are made of aware of any incidences and an increase in presence is required. A new toilet block will be opened by the end of February. Duty Staff will be reminded.
- Some girls would like to have the opportunity to play rugby it was suggested that they
 contact Miss LaLonge to discuss the possibility of joining her rugby group.

Year 8

No Year 8 reps present.

Year 9

 The new non-school uniform days not successful. Students unhappy about the colour themed day – this was a recreated theme across other year groups – Sixth Form students said that non-uniform day can be seen as 'judgment day' with some students unable to afford fashionable clothes. Action: To alternate Charity days with non-uniform and then thematic with uniform – students happy with this compromise.

Year 10

- HW generally lots continued irregularities with the setting of home learning in some subjects. Work set with a short lead time to be completed.
- Double classes are not great. Double Maths you're allowed to walk about in between the lessons but not in English. The double lessons tends to generate more home learning too.

Year 11

- Students would like clarification on the jewellery policy.
- Year 11 HW lots some are finding it stressful but the exams are not far away.
- Sixth Form and FE College advice very good

Year 12

- Good mixing between Year 12 and Year 13 in the Sixth form common areas.
- Better timetabling for next year; better spread of lessons across the week and fewer twilights if possible.

Year 13

- Mock exams went smoothly, invigilators commented on their good behaviour.
- Lots of work taking place within the Ocean group.
- Planning a Women's International day.

School priorities 2022/2023

Reaching the halfway point in the academic year and Dr Ingate's main priorities are:-

- Ensuring that we have good quality teaching at Birchwood. Ensure that work is marked, lesson observations are conducted and more challenging lessons.
